Engineering Leadership Scheme Advanced Award

Engineers make a difference. We conceive and create the things that save, enable and enhance lives. The career choices available to an engineer are vast, offering job satisfaction and prosperity.

The Engineering Leadership Scheme was created by The Royal Academy of Engineering to help undergraduate engineering students, the engineers of tomorrow, realise their potential and achieve their goals.

The Advanced Award is open to second year MEng undergraduates on a four year engineering degree (or third year undergraduates on a five year degree).

The Awards are made to provide carefully planned training and experience over three years which may not be available through your university, but which will furnish you with the skills and capacity to fast-track your career after graduating.





You write a personal development plan.

You choose the training you want to undertake. This can include business courses, language training, technical development, project management or any recognised professional development course.

If you are successful, we provide the financial means for you to undertake your chosen courses.

We provide you with a mentor.

You are allocated up to £5,000 to carry out your personal development plan over a period of three years.

The main selection criteria for these awards are:

- 1 You must be registered on an accredited university MEng engineering degree course in the second year of a four year course **OR** on the third year of a five year course
- 1 You must want to become an inspirational role model to the next generation of engineers
- 1 You must want to reach a position of project or team leadership within engineering industry within 5 years of graduation
- 1 You should know how to take full advantage of the benefits of the scheme
- 1 You are expecting to contribute significantly to the ongoing health and impact of the scheme (The Royal Academy of Engineering requires Advanced Award holders to give at least one presentation about the scheme to undergraduates at their own or any other university)
- 1 You do not need to be a UK citizen; international students are welcome to apply

Are you a second year MEng undergraduate on a four year engineering degree (or third year undergraduate on a five year degree) and interested in the Advanced Award?

The scheme is open for applications from September to December 2011.
